

## Champions of good governance

As a business you will want to know if a charity you are going to support has any weaknesses in its governance that may put the charity at risk and your business. For that matter, if your relationship with a charity spans several years then the on going monitoring of the governance of a supported charity is just as important.

With the UK Government and the Charity Commission backing a drive to improve governance in the charity sector it is worth considering how businesses can support this agenda when deciding on which charities to support or be a donor to. *This puts businesses in a commanding position to champion the regulator's agenda to improve governance in the charity sector.*

### Do the right thing

When deciding which charity to support, do you apply due diligence just as you would for a supplier in your supply chain? Many failures in the charity sector have been attributed to poor governance and a charity's governance was hard to assess before the availability of Digi-Board's online charity governance self-assessment.

When comparing the two routes below to select a charity to support, which would you have more confidence in?

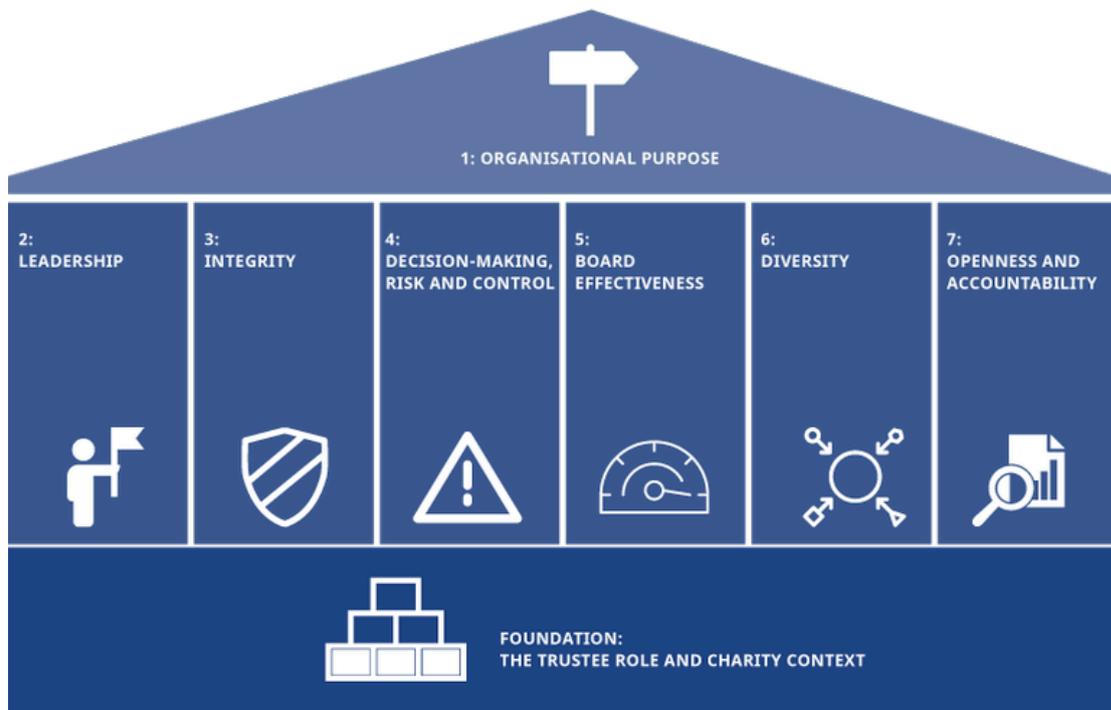

Option 2 has a charity completing the Digi-Board online charity governance self-assessment.

The examination of a charity's governance should precede the decision to support a charity, requiring them to demonstrate their commitment to a standard of governance demanded by the regulator.

## Step change in charity governance

The Charity Commission in a statement announcing the new Charity Code of Governance (the 'Code') in July 2017 stated the purpose of the Code is: *'to help charities and their trustees develop high standards of governance. As a sector, we owe it to our beneficiaries, stakeholders and supporters to demonstrate exemplary leadership and governance.'*
